## **House GOP Conference Chair Rep. Cathy** McMorris Rodgers To Address ACA #Summit24

PITTSBURGH, March 9, 2017 - The American Cable Association is very pleased to announce that U.S. Rep. Cathy McMorris Rodgers (R-Wash.), who as Chair of the House Republican Conference is the fourth highest-ranking Republican and the highest-ranking female Republican in the House of Representatives, will address ACA members on March 29 at their 24th annual policy summit in Washington, D.C.

Rep. McMorris Rodgers is a rising star in American politics. Since first being elected to the House in 2004, she has earned the trust of her constituents and praise on Capitol Hill for her hard work, conservative principles, bipartisan outreach, and leadership and gave the official Republican response to President Obama's State of the Union address in 2014.

As Chair of the House Republican Conference since 2012, Rep.
